COCOON CARE is an upholstered acoustic pod that shields the user from external stimuli, creating a calm environment to reduce stress and aid disregulated behaviour.

RELAXATION, REST AND CONCENTRATION

The Cocoon design, with its sound-absorbing walls and rounded form, allows users to withdraw from their surroundings without completely disconnecting from the external environment.

Cocoon Care can be used as both a quiet space for focus and a sound booth. LED task lighting is built into the structure and can be switched on or off depending on the user needs. Users are also able to utilise the built-in speakers to play their own audio, or listen to our specially-devised soundtrack.
